

## 2012 Legislative Agriculture Chairs Summit

## Resolution on Interference with GPS Frequencies

Whereas, the State Ag and Rural Leaders, (SARL) is comprised of agriculture and

rural leaders of state legislative bodies from the US and Canada; and

Whereas, a company is seeking to start a nationwide satellite/terrestrial network of

high-powered ground transmission stations and resell broadband access in a project that will expand wireless broadband access but uses signals

that are close to the GPS satellite signals; and

**Whereas,** SARL seeks to expand broadband access across the rural communities;

and

**Whereas,** SARL also recognizes the importance of GPS accuracy in everything

from precision agriculture to airplanes and emergency vehicles; and

**Whereas,** research has shown that the high-powered GPS receivers could receive

substantial interference from high-powered, close-proximity

transmissions such as those proposed; and

Whereas, interference with existing GPS signals would have serious impact on the

agricultural, construction and aviation industries; now therefore be it

**Resolved,** that SARL join the Coalition to Save Our GPS; and be it further

**Resolved,** that the interference issue be addressed before the Federal

Communications Commission provides additional approval to the

satellite/terrestrial network proposal; and be it further

**Resolved.** that this resolution be submitted to the White House. United States

Congress and the chair of the Federal Communications Commission.
