- Sugar beet




Nearly all GE = resistance to Pests or Pesticide



### Market for GE Seed


### Share of Proprietary Seed Market: 2007








Chart 1. Trends in the Percent of National Crop Acreage Planted to Herbicide-Tolerant and *Bt* Transgenic Crops, 1996-2004

### Why Label?

#### Overwhelming Public Support

Various polls show upwards of 90% in favor of GE Labeling

#### Public Policy In Favor of Disclosure

 Consumer protection laws already on books evidence goal of <u>informed consumers</u> as "essential to the fair and efficient functioning of a free market economy" 15 U.S.C. 1451

#### Protection of Export Markets

Sixty-four countries, including Japan, S. Korea, China,
Australia, Russia, Malaysia, and the EU require GE Labeling



### Who Should Require Labeling?

#### Federal Attempts at Mandatory GE Labeling

- Senator Barbara Boxer (D-California) and Congressman Peter DeFazio (D-Oregon) introduce "GE Food Right to Know Act"
- Introduced April 2013
- Status = In Committee

### State Attempts at Mandatory GE Labeling

- By 2013, over ½ of all states have proposed legislation including AK, AZ, CO, CT, HI, IL, IN, IA, ME, MD, MA, MN, MO, NV, NH, NJ, NY, OR, PA, RI, TN, VT, WA, WV
- No state has adopted
- Getting close in ME, CT, VT, and RI



## **Challenges to Requiring Labeling**

#### First Amendment

 Regulation of commercial speech must be "reasonably related" to the protection of legitimate government interests

#### Dormant Commerce Clause

 Regulation can't impose a "clearly excessive burden" on interstate commerce as compared to state benefit

#### Preemption

- Supremacy Clause (Art. VI, cl. 2) says there can be no conflict with federal law
- FDCA as amended by NLEA as an express preemption provision, 21 U.S.C. 343-1, listing preempted categories
